This reprogramming action transfers funds between appropriations for proper execution. The reclassification is required to execute funds properly in accordance with congressional intent. The Department will use the RDT&E funding to conduct research by providing grant funds to states. This funding would be tied to a requirement for participating states to provide data and information to the Department, which will be evaluated and shared with all states and territories for use in carrying out their requirements under the Uniformed and Overseas Citizens Absentee Voting Act. The 24-month election cycle requires time for states to develop and test the processes funded by the grants. This action does not change the purpose for which the funds were originally appropriated.
