Pursuant to 10 U.S.C. § 3136(c), this reprogramming action transfers \$34.499 million from various Army and Air Force appropriations to the Defense Modernization Account. These amounts and sources have been determined to be available for transfer as excess to the requirements of their respective programs as a result of efficiencies, economies, and other cost savings achieved in carrying out an acquisition program, consistent with 10 U.S.C. § 3136(c)(1)(B)(i). Amounts transferred to the Defense Modernization Account will remain available for transfer and obligation until the end of the third fiscal year that follows the fiscal year in which the amounts are deposited into the account. This reprogramming action will not cause the balance of the Defense Modernization Account to exceed \$1 billion.

Explanation: Funds are available for transfer to the Defense Modernization Account, Defense-Wide, from the Mobile Protected Firepower program due to the decision to terminate the M10 Booker program. The decision to terminate the M10 Booker Combat Vehicle supported the strategic objectives outlined in the Army Transformation Initiative, resulting in savings to the Army and excess funding to the program.

Explanation: Funds are available for transfer to the Defense Modernization Account, Defense-Wide, from a congressional increase for the C-130H NP2000 Eight Bladed Propeller due to the completion of the modification effort for the fleet. Efficiencies in quantity were achieved due to additional C-130J procurement, which reduced the number of C-130H NP2000 Eight Bladed Propeller modifications required as remaining unmodified C-130Hs will be divested. This is a congressional special interest item.

Explanation: Funds are available for transfer to the Defense Modernization Account, Defense-Wide, from a congressional increase for F-15EX to integrate aluminum microtube heat exchangers (AMHE). The proposed AMHE does not meet required Technology Readiness Levels needed for commercialization. The vendor was unable to produce an acceptable AMHE prototype for use on the F-15EX and the Air Force halted the effort to avoid risk of cost overruns and the program ending without tangible benefits. This is a congressional special interest item.
