This reprogramming action transfers funds within and between appropriations for proper execution. The reclassification is required to execute funds properly in accordance with congressional intent. These actions are determined to be necessary in the national interest. These actions do not change the purpose for which the funds were originally appropriated. This reprogramming action meets all administrative and legal requirements, and none of the items have been previously denied by the Congress. **This reprogramming impacts the Military Intelligence Program (MIP).**

PART I of this reprogramming action transfers \$26.812 million between Army appropriations. This reprogramming action uses \$26.812 million of general transfer authority pursuant to Section 8005 of division A of Public Law 119-75, the Department of Defense Appropriations Act, 2026

PART II of this reprogramming action realigns \$83.32 million within various Defense appropriations for proper execution.

Explanation: Funds are required to be transferred to the Aircraft Procurement, Army, 26/28, appropriation from the Operation and Maintenance, Army, 26/26, appropriation to modernize Opposing Forces (OPFOR) aircraft at the Joint Readiness Training Center (JRTC) via the procurement and installation of aviation compliant Land Mobile Radios (LMR) on three UH-72 Lakota and 11 UH-60 Blackhawk helicopters. The current systems are required to enable safe flight operations in the Combat Training Center (CTC) environment. When funds were originally budgeted for the Army's CTC modernization effort, Army planners believed the modernization effort was an Operation and Maintenance, Army (OMA) funded effort. However, as the detailed planning process continued into the year of execution and specific CTC spend plans were finalized, it became clear that some items are consistent with procurement expenditures.
