Project Description: A specially designed National Guard Readiness Center that will be designed to meet Industry Standards as well as all local, State, and Federal building codes and as per P.L. 90-480. Construction will include all utility services, information systems, fire detection and alarm systems, roads, walks, curbs, gutters, storm drainage, parking areas and site improvements.

Justification: This project was authorized for \$18.0 million in the Servicemember Quality of Life Improvement and National Defense Authorization Act for FY 2025, P.L. 118-159. The \$16.1 million is required to fully fund the project. Project was not funded with appropriated funds in FY 2025 and requires an above threshold reprogramming.

Project Description: Construct a new operations building with a laboratory which includes offices, mechanical and electrical infrastructure, plumbing, HVAC, communications, and work necessary for a working fuel operations facility. The new fuel distribution facility will include fuel storage tanks, product recovery tank, truck fill stand, and offload station along with site piping, filter separators, and all other necessary equipment. Piping will also connect to new flightline fuel dispensing cabinets. Canopies to protect equipment in this harsh environment are also included.

Justification: An additional \$1.612 million is needed to provide a complete and useable project that meets mission requirements. The cost increase is due to a combination of a design change and market uncertainty from tariff impacts. Design refinements resulted in an increase in the length of fuel piping based on a changed site layout to accommodate safety requirements and stand-off distances. Contractors indicated tariff uncertainty increased their bids to mitigate potential cost risks.

A 10 U.S.C. §2853 cost variation notification dated August 11, 2025, was submitted to Congress.
